## PHIL'S OFFICIAL LIST OF 45 SPIRITUAL GIFTS NOT MENTIONED IN THE BIBLE

Everyone in my circle of Christian friends believes every saved person has a "spiritual gift" [*Eph 4.11*]. They also believe we each have service to perform in our local churches. But almost to a person they seem to think that everyone's gift is in a list in some chapter of the Bible.

There is no list of all the gifts anywhere in the Bible.

We've all compared the 5 lists: Romans 12 I Corinthians 12 I Corinthians 12 *[the second list]* Ephesians 4 *[one verse]* I Peter 4 *[2 verses, 2 gifts]* 

None of the lists are the same.

The Bible never says name your gift. It only says use your gift.

Here's help. Of course this list is funny, but that's not why I wrote it. I'll stand behind the probability that every one of these activities is part of somebody's gift.

Maybe [part of] your spiritual gift is:

<b>praying</b> for every person in your congregation. Maybe it is <b>teaching</b> or <b>singing</b> or <b>passing out</b> tracts or providing <b>snacks</b> for a Sunday School class or <b>counseling</b> friends or <b>babysitting</b> during the teen youth meetings or <b>parking</b> cars or carrying <b>umbrellas</b>	or helping or inviting folks to come to church or cooking for church dinners or giving 25% [you don't have to have much] or nursery care or driving kids home after youth meetings or office work maybe it is praying for Sunday School teachers
or <b>praying</b> for youth group speakers	or praying for AWANA leaders during meetings
or making a copy each week of those who were saved over the internet and <b>praying for them by name</b>	
or by <b>country</b>	
or straightening the hymnbooks	or running the office <b>copy machine</b> once a week
or folding and stapling	or shining the pastor's shoes
or <b>trimming</b> the pastor's bushes	or <b>washing</b> the pastor's car
or <b>shampooing</b> the pastor's rugs annually	or <b>buying</b> church supplies
or running church office errands	or doing <b>hospital</b> visitation
or making a prayer list from requests on Wed nite and distributing it by church email	
or <b>vacuuming</b>	or doing <b>odd jobs</b> around the church
or being the permanent <b>babysitter</b> for families who go witnessing at the mall on Friday nites	
or <b>trimming</b> bushes	or <b>planting and tending</b> the flowers at the church
or bringing two small pots of flowers from your backyard each week to put on the platform	
or <b>washing</b> church windows twice a year	or Airport shuttle for missionaries
or finding ways to make the church leadership more efficient	
or giving free rides to anybody - day or night	
or taking every church visitor to Wendy's after church [maybe once a month]	
or talking to every visitor who sits in your row	
orwell, you get it, [psstyou don't need to know the name of your gift—just use it!]
