

Giving a Public [or an Individual] Invitation

1. "Do you believe Jesus died for you?"
2. "Do you believe His promise that you will have eternal life if you trust Him?"
His promise is in John 3.16 "whosoever believeth. . . ."
3. "If I trust in Him, and believe that he died for me, do I have eternal life in heaven?"
4. "Are you believing in Him right now?"
5. "Where will you go when you die? Heaven Hell

KEY QUESTION

6. "How do you know?" (*the answer is a sentence, not just a word*)

SECOND KEY QUESTION

7. "What does the Bible say?"

NOW IS THE TIME TO ENCOURAGE THE CHILD TO PRAY—after he is certain of his salvation and knows he has a home in heaven and is depending on a Bible verse for his salvation.

Praying to Jesus does not save. Faith saves.

8. "Why don't you thank Jesus right now for dying for you and giving you a home in His perfect heaven?"

After a child puts his trust in Jesus as his individual Savior, he should understand the Gospel clearly enough to be able to go home and tell his parents:

1. God has never sinned in His whole life
2. I know I've done things wrong
3. Being good doesn't take anybody's sin away
4. I believe Jesus died for my own sin
5. The Bible tells me so, and there's a promise that tells me I have eternal life.
6. **Mom & Dad, will you believe in Jesus the same way, please!**
