

By the way, one way to witness is to do nothing but quote or read Bible verses to your friend.

Question #1

“Do you know where you’re going when you die?”
“Why do you think that?”
or
“Could you explain that?”

*[Now just listen and “Mm-hmm,” a lot until he starts repeating himself. Maybe ask a couple innocuous questions.]
Ask him if you could just read [or quote] 9 Bible verses and ask him to explain them to you without comment or disagreement.

Question #2

“Has anyone every taken a Bible and showed you how you could be absolutely sure of knowing where you will go when you die?”

[Just wait for the tiniest affirmative response.]

Turn to verse after significant verse and ask him to read it and tell you in his own words what it say.

Response #3

At some point you could say, “That’s a good question. Would you let me read 6 verses from the Bible before I answer that question?”

Response #4

Oo-o-o, oo-oo, here’s another verse you’d like. Could you read this to me?

Response #5

Another approach might be to say. Would you let me read 6 verses from the Bible which explain how we can be sure of eternal life, and then we can talk about it?

These are the verses I encourage you to use. They are the same ones I use in the Heaven Test, in this order.

James 2.10	Romans 3.23	Ephesians 2.8,9	Titus 3.5
Galatians 2.16	Romans 6.23	I Corinthians 15.3,4	Acts 16.31
John 3.16	John 6.47	I John 5.13
