- 4.31 advice about obliterating: <u>wrath, anger, & clamor</u>, don't save up ammunition from your last fight
   \* Bitterness leads to unforgiveness self-righteousness hatred long term grudge
- 4.32 <u>AS</u> = IN EXACTLY THE SAME WAY AS CHRIST forgave you, Phil!
- 5.1 <u>be imitators of me</u>, I Cor 4.16 11.1 Phil 3.17 4.9 I Thes 1.6 II Tim 2.2 3.7,9 [5 books] walk, verses 1,8,15 notes at 4.1
- 5.3 <u>not be once named</u>, not even a hint in my life
- 5.4 <u>neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting</u>, coarse talk, obscene jokes, bathroom humor, rudeness, dirty jokes, polished sarcasm
- 5.16 <u>time</u>, "tempus fugit" = Latin for time flies, vapor, vanity [Ecclesiastes, ?X] One commentator calls it "soap bubbles"
- 5.18 **be filled**,

  - Thanksgiving, v.20
  - Subject to one another, v.21
- 5.21 <u>submitting yourselves one to another</u>, "This is my #1 message to believing couples!" *Pastor Tim* Men must forfeit their independent streak when they get married. There is no dictatorship in a happy marriage.
- 5.23 <u>husband is the head</u>, don't like this? Don't get married. Sorry, can't change God's rules. This is chain-of-command, not order of importance.
  - \* When I was Vice President of Academic Affairs I was not necessarily the best professor on staff, but I was considered, "first among equals."
  - \* Headship among equal marriage partners. God says, "The buck stops here." The husband's decision is final. The discussion can continue in peace. All husbands know that a woman's perspective is better than a man's sometimes. Many times. Look back at 4.29.
- 5.22-33 good marriage counsel is for a couple to read this passage a dozen times aloud and discuss the whys and hows. Maybe twice each time you're together several different times.
- 5.25 Christ gave Himself. . .for it [the Church],

## THE WALK, chapter 6

6.12

- 6.1 <u>obey</u>, not slowly, not with bad attitude, not partially, not just outwardly [remember we had 9 kids, over 19 year spread] Never had a 2 year-old go through the "terrible twos." They learned early.
- 6.2 <u>honor</u>, kids can develop a great inward attitude
- 6.4 *dads*, are more guilty of this than moms, I have to admit
- 6.11 *nurture & admonition* = discipline & instruction,
  - \* Our job is not to get them to obey, but to get them to enjoy obeying.
  - \* Become a specialist in studying each kid's bent.
  - <u>wrestle</u>, agonidzo αγονιδζο = straining at hard work, needing more consistency than grunting
    - Heb 12.1 run with patience the race
    - I Tim 4.2 fought a good fight
    - 6.18 *praying always*: pray, petition, ask, supplication, commune, talk, intreat
