Introduction

- 1. Perhaps the very first or second NT book ever written.
- 2. A letter written by James, Jesus' little brother, pastor of the Jerusalem church.

- 3. Audience: brethren (16X), believers—1.2,16 2.14 3.1,10 4.11 5.9
- Audience: the <u>scattered</u>, the Diaspora, 1.1 [diaspora, διασπορα] because of the persecution in Jerusalem, Acts 8.1
 These were James' former sheep.
- 5. Major theme: the believers' works, mouth, money, trouble, judging others

James = they are displayed to glorify God, Matt 5.16

Paul = salvation is "not of works" to earn eternal life, Eph 2.8,9

- 6. There are only about 10 words of introductory greeting.
- 7. Entire book is very practical.
- 8. This is a collection of 18 sermonettes which I believe pastor James had already preached when the <u>scattered</u> had been living in Jerusalem. They are almost cryptic vignettes which his former congregation would remember.
- 9. No organization. One topic doesn't lead into the next.
- 10. Most often repeated themes: works, faith, suffering because of Christ, abuses of the rich, contentment, trouble gives you an edge on growing mature [problems produce perfection—maturity]
- 11. Key verses: 1.22 be doers
 - 2.26 faith without works is useless
- 12. No epistle mentions Jesus' name less except III John.
- 13. Author introduces himself as a servant [doulos, δουλοσ] of Jesus, not trading on family ties.

Jesus had 4 brothers [Matt 13.55]. James was mentioned first [oldest?].

- 14. Rich people are mentioned [4X?] in a negative light.
- 5. There are 54 imperative statements, i.e. "do this."
- 16. "Perhaps the best Greek in the new Testament." Moulton & Howard's commentary
- 17. Subtitle of the book might be: "How to walk while the world is watching."
