- 1. Acts 13.50 Antioch Pisidia in Galatia [western Turkey]
 - 13.14 in synagogue
 - 13.39 "you could not be freed by the Law of Moses
 - 13.42 some eager learners
 - 13.45 Jews furious
 - 13.46 "We go to the Gentiles"
 - 13.50 Jews agitated Jewish women
- 2. Acts 14.5 [almost] stoned in Iconium, Turkey
 - 14.1 preached in synagogue
 - 14.5 Jews attempted stoning
- 3. Acts 14.19 Paul stoned to death, Antioch & Iconium [2nd visit]
 - 14.19, 20 Paul raised from the dead
- 4. Acts 16.19 Philippi, Greece/Macedonia, Europe
 - 16.18 demon cast out of girl soothsayer
 - 16.19 owners dragged Paul out of city [by the heels?]
 - almost a riot
- 5. Acts 17.5 Thessalonika
 - 17.1,2 preached in synagogue
 - 17.5 jealous mob in uproar
 - 17.6 dragged Jason out [by the heels?]
- 6. Acts 19.25 Ephesus, Diana's temple is one of the 7 Wonders of the World
 - 19.1 met disciples at Ephesus
 - 19.9 some hardened
 - 19.7 7 evil spirits
 - 19.19 many magicians saved, burn sorcery books
 - 19.23 silversmiths form a mob gathering
 - 19.34 "Great is Diana of the Ephesians"
- 7. Acts 21.27-31 Jerusalem, Temple area
 - 21.27 Asian Jews stir up crowd in Temple area
 - Paul arrested
- 8. Acts 22.13-24 In the castle, on the stairs, Paul gives testimony
 - 21.33 already under arrest
 - 22.1 asks permission to give a defense
 - 22.20 he had consented to Stephen's death
 - 22.21 mentions that Jesus told Paul "I will send you to the Gentiles
 - 22.22 soldiers rescue him from being killed
- 9. Acts 23.9,10 Jerusalem, Pharisee argument, almost a riot
 - 21.23 Paul shouts loudly before the Sanhedrin, "...the resurrection of the dead!"
 - 23.9 a great uproar
 - 23.10 danger of being "torn to pieces"
- 10. Acts 23.12 Assassination pact, 40 men
 - 23.14 "neither eat nor drink. . .until we have killed Paul."

Addendum (death threats)

- * Acts 9.24 "laying await. . .day and night to kill (Paul)" Damascus
- * Acts 9.29 "but they went about to slay him"
